Oldfield has been involved with AI for over 10 years beginning as a Certified Golf Course Sanctuary and then being one of the first neighborhoods to be a part of their green communities program. In 2015 we earned the title as a Neighborhood for

Nature and with that momentum the natural progression was to move towards becoming certified as a Sustainable Community. In the beginning of 2018 we achieved that goal and became the 8th community in the country to hold this prestigious title.

The certification process involves 3 stages of assessment, planning and implementing goals through action plans. The community must come together to establish priorities from 15 broad focus areas and develop a plan for meaningful results. Oldfield worked closely with the Audubon during the process to create a plan tailored specifically to our needs, priorities, resources and challenges.

With community involvement and support we now have a plan containing sustainable goals for implementing now and into the future. These plans include recycling across the community, pond management, lawn care, pest management, energy conservation and health and wellness and so much more.
